The inspiration of the Encounter Project comes from Pope Francis, especially his encyclicals Fratelli Tutti (2020) and Laudato Si' (2015). 
educational and ecological poverties that affect all of us — most especially the poor and disenfranchised. He invites all persons of good will to "dialogue on how we are shaping



the future of our planet and the need to employ the talents of all, since all change requires an educational process aimed at developing a new universal solidarity and a more welcoming society.







Gross Catholic faculty and students have begun planning and implementing projects surrounding the objectives of the Encounter Project. Our Environmental Science class, taught by Ms. Leah Schwartz, is working on creating a recycling plan for the school. Students are making posters and a video to explain what can be recycled and where to put it. In January, Mrs. Michele Sweetmon, Campus Minister, is working with a group of students to create awareness of Fast Fashion and why it is so harmful to the environment. In the spring, we will host a week-long technology recycling project. All of these are great examples of integrating environmental learning with service in the Marianist spirit.

The Marianist Family is particularly well-suited to respond to Pope Francis's invitation because of our shared charism: to excel at adaptation and change, working together in family spirit to provide an integral, quality education that emphasizes formation in faith and prioritizes service towards justice, peace, and the integrity of creation.

The goal of the Encounter Project is to carry out the Pope's seven common objectives:

- 1 RESPOND TO THE CRY OF THE EARTH
- 2 RESPOND TO THE CRY OF THE POOR
- **3** FOSTER ECOLOGICAL ECONOMIES
- 4 ADOPT A SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLE
- 5 OFFER ECOLOGICAL EDUCATION
- 6 DEVELOP ECOLOGICAL SPIRITUALITY
- 7 SUPPORT LOCAL COMMUNITIES

As the Marianist school of Omaha, Gross Catholic is committed to joining our worldwide family in mission along a seven-year journey to promote these strategies. Each year we will concentrate on these consecutive focus areas. The Encounter Project challenges us to envision bold ways of bringing together our shared hopes, creativity, talents, and resources, working on focused

local initiatives and projects that will make a meaningful contribution to the seven response areas.

With Mary as our model of discipleship, the meaning and measure of being a Marianist family is how we respond in love to the weakest among us. We acknowledge that individually none of us can do everything to overcome the massive inequalities in education or perfectly obey God's call in Genesis to be stewards of the earth. Still, we each must do something. The success of the Encounter Project will depend on the efforts of the entire Gross Catholic family: students, teachers, administration, parents, board of directors, alumni, and coaches.

Purposefully Compassionate

The 2022 - 2023 school theme is "Blessed are the Peacemakers", inspired by St. Francis of Assisi (Barrett House patron saint). As a school, students and faculty/staff participate in experiences and prayer that encourage conflict resolution, finding inner peace, and seeking reconciliation with the Lord. As a school that is purposely compassionate, we strive to live by the words of St. Francis of Assisi, "to heal wounds, to bind what is broken, to bring home those who are lost." For that reason, Campus Ministry has redesigned its Marianist Mission Program to create more of an encounter for students when they complete service. The intention is to pull students out of their comfort zone to work with new people, in order to gain an appreciation for differences and to hone their leadership skills.

These lessons in compassion and continued care begin with our freshmen students. These students spend time the summer before their freshman year volunteering at the Food Bank of the Heartland. There they work side-by-side with new classmates. building relationships with each other and serving the community by preparing pantry items to be sent out to organizations like Heart Ministry Center in North Omaha. Our sophomores, seniors, and faculty/staff then have the opportunity to directly serve those who are materially poor at the Heart Ministry Center. Our students, faculty and staff are able to encounter our brother and sisters heart-toheart: to enter into authentic conversations with members of the Fresh Start Program; and to literally walk with those experiencing material poverty.



Freshman Service Day

Nearly every one of the students we brought to the Heart Ministry Center said that the experience opened their hearts and minds to the needs of others and to the possibility that we really could live in peace and equality with one another if we would only apply the principles of Heart Ministry Center to our daily lives.

Sophomore Alyvia Christensen shared that "You make relationships with people you would've never had a chance to know. It's a great way to spread the love and kindness of God." Marie Brousek, sophomore, added, "My experience with my class at Heart Ministry was incredible. Being able to help those who are less fortunate than us and seeing the joy and community that they have was inspiring. This experience helped me see God in others and grow in community with those around me."

In addition to these experiences in compassion, sophomore and senior students examined causes of poverty in the Omaha Metro area and are encouraged to continue to bring Christ to our world today.

Academically Driven

Gross Catholic has always been known for tailoring its curriculum to its students' needs. When the high school first opened its doors in the late 60's, students were able to take woodshop and other various courses to gain hands-on experience and prepare for jobs in the trade industry, if they desired. In the early 2000's the curriculum shifted and began to offer ACT Prep and AP courses to help better prepare its students to go onto post secondary institutions. During this time the laptop program commenced, which helped incorporate technology in the classroom and jumpstart a new wave of learning for students.

In the last couple of years, Gross Catholic has undergone not just a facelift to its academic wing, but a new shift to add more dual enrollment classes. Students who successfully complete these classes earn college credit in addition to high school credit. These courses will also expand student's knowledge for their future career choice and give them a head start after they graduate. Many of these dual enrollment classes are offered through new Academic Academies, which were introduced in the fall of 2021. The Academies grant students real-life experiences and opportunities for networking outside the traditional classroom setting.

Tim Powers, Dean of Curriculum and Faculty Support, oversees the dual enrollment courses. "The dual enrollment classes allow us to partner with local universities and colleges as well as places like CHI Health. It gives students a handson and unique learning experience based on whatever track program they are enrolled in," Powers says.

Senior Audrey Swanson has been studying nursing in the Health Sciences Career Academy. "I started the nursing track program when I was a junior, taking online classes through Metropolitan Community College," Swanson says. "I just earned my CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) certification this past summer." Swanson's recent certification allows her to divy her time between school and CHI Health Immanuel Hospital, allowing her to apply what she's learning in her classes to the workplace.

I've always known I wanted to pursue a career in the medical field," Swanson says.

"It just makes sense that Gross Catholic provides classes and academies for us students, giving us the experience not just for college, but after college too.

Students aren't the only ones attaining certifications for the academies. Gross Catholic's teachers are required to have at least a master's degree to teach the college level courses as well attain any specific certifications which come along with facilitating dual enrollment courses.



"Our students are getting all the benefits of a university level course, but our classes are still in person and smaller," Nano says. "This just allows us to continue to show our students more and give them the attention they need."

This past year, Gross Catholic added the Athletic Training Track Program. Students are able to take classes such as Care and Prevention of Medical Injuries and Medical Terminology which are just a handful of the newly catered courses in the program. Senior Jake Garcia, who is part of the Athletic Training Track Program hopes to pursue a career in physical therapy. "I came to Gross Catholic because I wanted to play football here," Garcia recalls. "But this school gives us students the opportunity to try different classes, supports what we might want to do in the future, and that's something that other kids my age aren't going to get anywhere else."
